A specialist on the British philosopher, essayist and social critic Bertrand Russell, Andrew Irvine has taught at the University of British Columbia since 1989.

He is a Canadian Commonwealth Fellow, a UBC Killam Fellow, a past Vice-Chair of the UBC Board of Governors, and Senior Advisor to the President on Student Housing.

Professor Irvine's edited books include *Physicalism in Mathematics* (1990), *Russell and Analytic Philosophy* (with G.A. Wedeking, 1993), *Bertrand Russell: Critical Assessments* (in 4 volumes, 1999), *Mistakes of Reason* (with Kent Peacock, 2005), *In the Agora* (with John Russell, 2006), and *Philosophy of Mathematics* (2009). He is the author of *Argument* (with John Woods and Douglas Walton, 2000; 2nd edn, 2004) and *Socrates on Trial* (2008).

Professor Irvine has served on numerous advisory boards, including the founding editorial board of the *Stanford Encyclopedia of Philosophy*, the Board of Directors of the Society for Academic Freedom and Scholarship, and the Board of Directors of the British Columbia Medical Services Foundation. He has also served as President and Chairman of the Board of Directors of the British Columbia Civil Liberties Association.

A graduate of the University of Saskatchewan, the University of Western Ontario and Sydney University, he has been an occasional contributor to several Canadian newspapers and has held visiting posts at Canadian and American universities.
